

## Virginia Junior Academy of Science Sponsor's Update January 2020

Dear Sponsors:

We look forward to hosting you at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, VA this year for the VJAS Annual Research Symposium. The Symposium will be held from May 27 - 29, 2020. **Presentations will be held on Thursday, May 28th.** 

As always, please refer to our Handbook and Appendices for complete, detailed information. Some MAJOR revisions were made this past summer - also enclosed with the sponsor's update is an abbreviated table of changes. Below are a number of important points we would like to highlight at this time.

- School and Individual Membership Fees were due by January 15. If you have not yet joined please contact
  the VAS/VJAS office.
- This year's deadline for submitting papers with the appropriate student entry fees is no later than Wednesday, February 19, 2020. Please use the VJAS Paper Submission Forms (Appendix C).
- Please pay attention to our <u>project "categories" list</u> in the Handbook pages 13-15. For this coming year, we
  will disqualify papers that are not in the proper category. If in doubt, please contact the VJAS Director or
  the VAS/VJAS Office for clarification and assistance.

- Frequent DQ issues

PSYCHOLOGY - within the paper, there MUST be a sample shown of an informed consent form (a screenshot, in-text figure in the methods section, etc. will work).

BIOLOGY - you MUST specify that the e. Coli strain is "non-pathogenic". Be as specific as you can in describing the substances you are working with.

CHEMISTRY and CHEMICAL SCIENCES - please include how safety precautions were taken in the methodology section. Describe what steps were taken and whether there was appropriate adult supervision.

GENERAL SAFETY - when in doubt, include/write the safety information (precautions, supervision, etc.) in the methodology section, check the safety certification boxes, and sign. It is best practice to explicitly state what safety precautions were taken - VJAS will NOT assume that the experiment was done safely and with appropriate supervision.

Please don't hesitate to contact us if you have any questions or suggestions, as well as knowing anyone interested in being a judge and/or a reader at the 2020 Symposium.
