

Virginia Junior Academy of Science Sponsor's Update October 2019

Dear Sponsors:

We look forward to hosting you at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, VA this year for the VJAS Annual Research Symposium. The Symposium will be held from May 27 – 29, 2020. Presentations will be held on Thursday, May 28th.

We have revised our VJAS Handbook and the Appendices and they are now available to download on our website (<u>http://vjas.org/handbook.html</u>). As always, please refer to our Handbook and Appendices for complete, detailed information. Some MAJOR revisions were made this past summer - also enclosed with the sponsor's update is an abbreviated table of changes. Below are a number of important points we would like to highlight at this time.

- REMINDER: The Phil Robinson Research Grant deadline is November 1. Please note your school must be a member at the time of submission.
- Please remember that Membership Application and Fees are due January 15. Please use the Membership Application (Appendix B). We are asking for complete information regarding the school and a flat fee of \$50/school.
- This year's deadline for submitting papers with the appropriate student entry fees is no later than Wednesday, February 19, 2020. Please use the VJAS Paper Submission Forms (Appendix C).
- Please pay attention to our <u>project "categories" list</u> in the Handbook pages 13-15. For this coming year, we will actively disqualify papers that are not in the proper category. If in doubt, please contact VJAS Director or the VAS/VJAS Office for clarification and assistance.
- Remember when working on projects look in the scholarship sections to see where they might fit.
