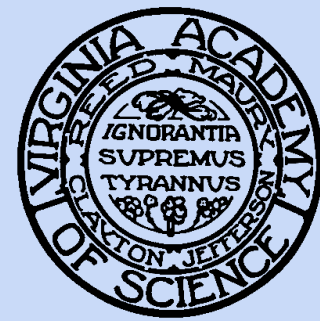

HENRY MACKENZIE ENVIRONMENTAL SCHOLARSHIP (VEE)

From Joe Maroon, VEE Executive Director

I am sorry that I am unable to be with you today but please allow me a brief word about the Virginia Environmental Endowment. VEE opened its doors for business on February 1, 1977 – before most of you here were born! The Endowment was the first philanthropic foundation in the nation to focus exclusively on improving our environment. Since then, VEE has made over 1400 grants that have resulted in over \$100 million of environmental improvement. If you are interested in learning more about the Endowment, I suggest you check out the website www.vee.org.

Every year since 1984, the VA Env. Endowment has provided two college scholarships to deserving high school students. To date, the Endowment has awarded \$660,000 in scholarship funds to 70 high school students. The scholarship programs are administrated by the Virginia Junior Academy of Science, and are named in honor of three founding members of VEE's Board of Directors.

The Frances and Sydney Lewis Environmental Science Scholarship is a \$5,000 four-year scholarship awarded to the student whose project presented at the annual Virginia Junior Academy of Science (VJAS) Research Symposium evidences the most significant contribution in the field of Environmental Science.

The Henry W. MacKenzie, Jr. Environmental Scholarship is also a \$5,000 four-year college scholarship that is awarded to the student whose project presented at the VJAS Research Symposium evidences the most significant contribution in the field of Environmental Science dealing with the James River Basin and Chesapeake Bay.

On behalf of VEE's Board of Directors, we congratulate this year's winners.





HENRY MACKENZIE ENVIRONMENTAL SCHOLARSHIP (VEE)

Henry MacKenzie Environmental Scholarship - This \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded to the twelfth grade student whose paper evidences the most significant contribution in the field of Environmental Science dealing with the James River Basin and Chesapeake Bay. The Virginia Environmental Endowment and VJAS offer this scholarship in tribute to the outstanding and generous services of Judge Henry W. MacKenzie, Jr., one of the founding directors, who has a great interest in the James River and the Chesapeake Bay.
